SHIEID: Or a borders vert, on a chevron agure 16 mullets pierced of the field; on a canton embattled (for the 6th Cavalry) vert (for the 3d Cavalry) a staff erect attached thereto a standard flotant or charged with a horseshoe heels upward encircling the Arabic numberal "life sable (for the 18th Cavalry).

Wills sable (for the 14th Cavalry).


